Pre-training Assessments

In order to support your participation in adult education, all those enrolling in our English Classes are required to undertake a pre-training review. This includes an initial assessment of your language, literacy and numeracy skills.

Our qualified assessor will help you identify the most suitable course for you, and will support you through the enrolment process. A non-refundable fee of \$50 will be charged for this assessment.



Fees and Charges

Lalor Neighbourhood House is a not-for-profit organisation so we keep our fees and charges as low as possible for fee for service students.

The Victorian Government provides subsidies for many of our courses: eligible students pay the Tuition Full Fee. Concessions may also be available — please contact our office to see if you qualify.

LNH provides a safe place respecting cultural, religious and sexual preferences. People with a disability are also encouraged to enrol.

Agency Referrals

Referrals from agencies seeking to place funded clients in English or Literacy classes are welcome. Initial assessment of learner needs costs \$50, or \$70 if a written report is requested by the referring agency. In accordance with ACFE Guidelines about Fees, the concession fees in this brochure do not apply to students whose fees are met by Commonwealth Government agencies or as part of a Commonwealth program or initiative.

Minimum Class Numbers

It should be noted that classes are subject to minimum enrolments, so some classes may be postponed or may not go ahead.
